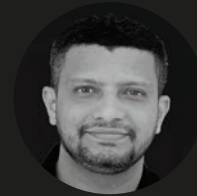

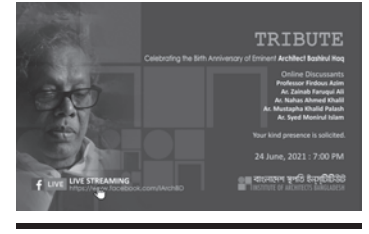

This year's winners were chosen from a group of 32 individuals and practices nominated by the members of the Academy. The jurors were Annabelle Selldorf (Chair), Kenneth Frampton, Steven Holl, Thom Mayne, Richard Meier, Toshiko Mori, Robert A. M. Stern, Billie Tsien, and Tod Williams.

Bangladeshi Project Bamboo Playscape awarded 'Medal of Excellence' in the 2020/2021 UIA Friendly & Inclusive Spaces Awards

The project from Bangladesh titled Bamboo Playscape, an inclusive playspace as part of a "Cycle of care" project by Ar. Kazi Meftahul Arefin (A-245) and the team had been awarded 'Medal of Excellence' in the 2020/2021 UIA Friendly & Inclusive Spaces Awards under the category 'Public and Open Spaces' on 29 April 2021.

The 3rd edition of the UIA Friendly and Inclusive Spaces Awards attracted 91 entries from 35 countries across the world. Despite widely varying economic, political, social and cultural contexts the submissions demonstrated how sensitive architectural design and collaborative processes can create inclusive, friendly and enabling environments.

Five juries, one from each UIA region, together with a past award winner, assessed the entries which were submitted in four categories – New Buildings, Refurbished Existing including Historic Buildings, Public and Open Spaces and Research. The assessment was conducted in two stages with 27 entries proceeding to the second stage.

Bamboo Playscape is a temporary pavilion collaboratively designed for inclusive community building, for play, performances of theatre and dance, and a beautiful social gathering place for women and their children. Designed and built as part of Paraa's radical new design course, CADSE, with Bamboo artisans, the children of LEEDO Peace Home and architecture students from Dhaka. A major impact has been bringing together the vulnerable children from the Peace Home, with their local neighbourhood children.

The need to play is inherent in all of us, and even more prominently in children of all ages, genders and abilities. Dhaka is the capital of Bangladesh, a sprawling dense megacity of over 21 million people and under enormous strain to provide adequate quality of parks and play spaces. This particular project is unique in its design and development, and will act as a precedent for much more radical, collaborative design projects in the future. The site of the Bamboo Playscape is in Washpur Garden City, on the west side of the Bunganga River.

Paraa's radical design course, CADSE: Critical Architecture, Design, and Sustainable Environments was borne out of the immediacy to address the need for widened critical design education and participation in the built environment through practical hands-on projects; the course is accredited in partnership with Independent University Bangladesh's School of Life Sciences. The fundamental aspect of this course is that the students have to work with a community to resolve a special design challenge, learning about land access, materials, space-making, environment and the ethics and politics related to creating socially-just spaces.

Paraa has worked closely with LEEDO, a grassroots children's charity, who run a home, and also focus rescuing trafficked children in Dhaka and elsewhere. Their home houses 50+ children, many of whom are differently abled, and from 2 years old to 16+, and of mixed gender.

The charity secured land adjacent to its Peace Home for three years. CADSE students were involved in formulating the program for the space with the children of LEEDO Peace Home, using participatory methods learned in the classroom. The program was then turned into a competition, with over 27 groups participating. The children of the home chose 2 designs; these two groups along with the CADSE students, were mentored and supported to finalise the design, resolving technical aspects. This was then built in collaboration with a team of Bamboo artisans.

The playspace offers a central open space, where children can play or organize festivals and performances. The whole structure can accommodate around 200 people at three different levels. Specific features designed to include therapeutic exercises for differently able children.

Younger children can engage in suitable play features, like swing, hanging rope-bridge, etc. In a safe place with elders' supervision, while older children find themselves in a more adventurous zone of climbing wall and the spider web. The semi-shaded decks of the playspace can hold different sorts of workshops or hang-outs of people of the different age groups of the local neighbourhood.

For the opening of the space, Paraa curated and commissioned a children's theatre production for a half-day festival of arts and culture and invited designers, thespians, fine artists, musicians, and others, to explore ways they can interact with people and the structure. "ESHO KHEL" (Let's play) was held to demonstrate the potential of the Bamboo space and the importance of the creative arts for holistic human development.

'IAB COVID-19 Awareness and Support Committee' Started to Stand Beside All Members

At the beginning of this year COVID condition got severe, 24th EC of IAB formed a committee to monitor and to serve better circumstances in this very situation. The newly formed committee relaunched some of the previous attempts taken by the 23rd Executive Council to maintain the continuity of the

helping initiative and launched some new ventures to support the severity of the situation.

Hence the COVID-19 Awareness & Support Committee was formed and started activities to assist all architects and their families regarding the health issues like

tele-medicine help desk, oxygen cylinder support; priority based blood and plasma bank; special services from selected hospitals and emergency financial aid. Besides these, the committee also applied to the government for priority based COVID-19 vaccination quota for all architects.

Tele-Medicine Support

IAB arranged a help desk to obtain service over the telephone and emails from a panel of doctors. Last year, IAB requested its members to connect doctors among their families and friends to consult architects including their family members in emergency named "IAB help desk".

This year, 24 doctors graciously accepted the re-invitation of 24th EC and formally commenced as "IAB Medical Help Desk" under the COVID-19 Awareness and Support Committee from 5th April 2021 where free emergency healthcare and consultation will be available for all architects and their families on weekdays (Sunday to Thursday) through telecommunication and online service during specific hours.

Doctors' other details, contact numbers and email addresses along with directives of consulting were sent to all IAB members through e-mails. Architects are requested to follow the regulations during availing this service.

IAB Celebrates 'Pohela Ashar' with Tree Planting Program at IAB Centre

On 15 June 2021 (the first day of 'Ashar' 1428), a 'Tree Planting Program' was organized at the premises of IAB Centre on the initiative of the Social Responsibility Committee of the Institute of Architects Bangladesh (IAB).

IAB President, Ar. Mubasshar Hussain called upon all architects to plant trees as a moral duty and said, "if necessary, two architects should plant a tree together and we should show compassion towards the environment." The 24th of June of this year (2021) was the 79th birth anniversary of late eminent architect Bashirul Haq. We lost him forever on 4th April 2020 on the verge of a world pandemic. To give a tribute to his life and remarkable architectural journey, the Institute of Architects Bangladesh (IAB) celebrated his birth anniversary by organizing a formal conversation on virtual media. The discussion was participated by the President of IAB Ar. Mubasshar Hussain, Vice President (National Affairs) Ar. Khan Md. Mustapha Khalid, IAB Fellow Ar. Nahas Ahmed Khalil, Professor Ferdous Azim (Bashirul Haq's wife), and his long-term colleague Ar. Syed Monirul Islam. The conversation was conducted by

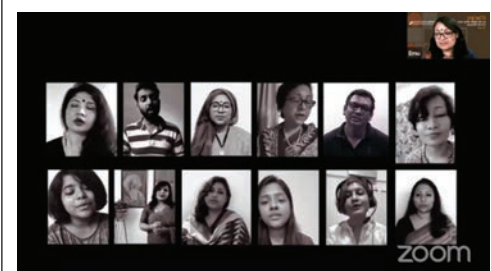
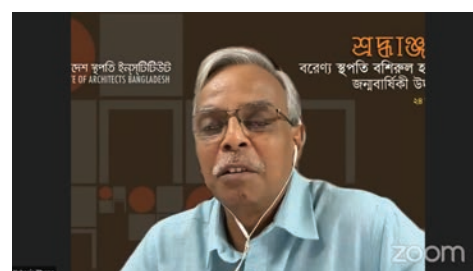
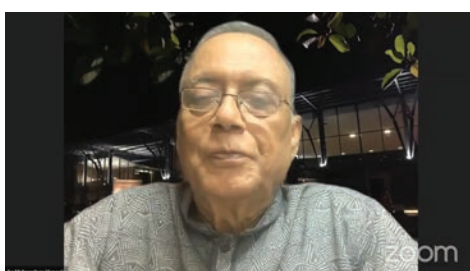
the General Secretary of IAB, Ar. Farhana Sharmin Emu.

The program started with the welcome speech of Ar. Mubasshar Hossain. After the speech, videography on the life and works of Architect Bashirul Haq was presented.

Ar. Nahas thanked the late architect for his guidance to the next generation of architects after Muzharul Islam. Ar. Mustapha expressed his gratitude to the late architect and praised his works by the term simple, local, and without artificiality. He also mentioned the use of local material in the projects demonstrates the true face of Bangladesh. Prof. Ferdous Azim

shared her personal memories about the amazing adventures and experiences with her husband. She also stated that the architecture of Bashirul Haq reflected his personality. Ar. Monirul, recalled, how unruffled Ar. Haq was and how he worked under him without any pressure.

All the participants expressed their deepest condolence towards the late architect and made a discussion about making a digital archive on the works of Ar. Bashirul Haq under IAB's custody. A wonderful showcase of chorus of Rabindro Shongeeet (*More Aro Dao Pran*) was displayed to tribute Ar. Bashirul Haq at the end of the program.



Sustainable Development Goals and Architects: Celebrating World Environment Day 2021

On the occasion of World Environment Day, IAB organized the webinar **Sustainable Development Goals and Architects** on 5 June 2021.

Mr. Tajul Islam, MP, Minister of Ministry of Rural Development and Cooperation of Local Government graced as the chief guest and eminent professor, writer, and social reformer Abdullah Abu Sayeed graced as one of the panel discussants. The main presentation on the titled topic was delivered by Ar. Md. Iqbal Habib. The webinar was moderated by the General Secretary of IAB, Ar. Farhana Sharmin Emu.

In the presentation, Ar. Habib explained the association of Architecture about the practice and SDG in Bangladesh. He included a brief database about the involvement of architects in achieving SDG. Also, he described

the important roles played by the Bangladeshi Architects in their practice towards achieving Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) at home and in the projects of the United Nations. Further, he mentioned the achievements of Bangladeshi Architects in winning awards in the practice of environmental-friendly architecture.

Professor Abdullah Abu Sayeed was impressed and complimented the discussion. He highlighted the importance of proper implementation of the rules of RAJUK and the other regulatory bodies in sustainable developments in cities.

The chief guest, Mr. Tajul Islam expressed his deepest concerns about environmental pollution. And, he expected a great deal of association between the architects, and the other professional bodies for successful implementation of

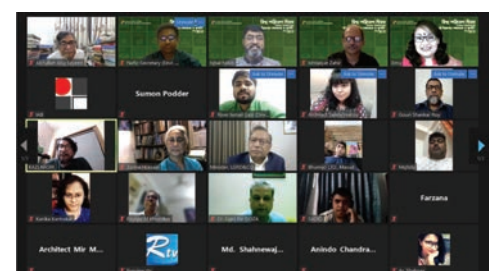
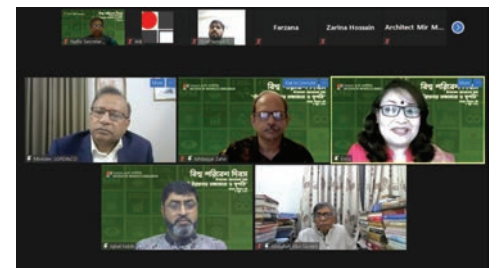

IAB Plays Active Role with Key Actors to Safeguard the Historic Ruplal House in Old Dhaka



24th Executive Council of IAB has been working with key actors and stakeholders in heritage sector to protect the heritage sites of Bangladesh. As a part of this strategy Ar. Mohammad Sazzad Hossain, Secretary, Heritage & Culture, IAB joined with representatives of Department of Archaeology (DoA), GOB and relevant expert investigated the approval process and procedural ground of the new construction work that was taking place at the historic Ruplal house premises.

On 25 May 2021, at Department of Archaeology, GOB, Ar. Sazzad, IAB; Ms. Rakhi Roy Regional Director (Dhaka), DoA, GOB; Ar. Khandokar Mahfuz Alam, Architect, DoA, GOB; Md. Golam Ferdous, DoA, GOB and Dr. Maliha Nargis Ahmed, DoA, Jahangir Nagar University examined all the approval documents presented by the representatives of the owner.

On the basis of the aforementioned documents, the

team identified huge gaps in the approval process and officially informed all the matters to the associated authorities including Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha (RAJUK) to take legal action. It may be mentioned that the Department of Archaeology (DoA), GOB declared Ruplal House as a heritage site for protection in 1989. Moreover, it is already enlisted as a heritage site in the 'Dhaka Mohanagar Imarat Nirman Bidhimala'.

The attempt to construct a new building at the heritage site has been stopped. Moreover, the chairman of RAJUK also declared to investigate the entire process of such approval and take necessary actions accordingly. However, IAB also kept communication with the Dhaka South City Corporation (DSCC). On 2 June 2021 the honourable Mayor of the DSCC, Sheikh Fazle Noor Taposh visited the site and expressed his interest to save the heritage.

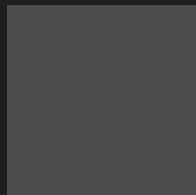
