120 YEARS of KAHN

Reverence Kahn: Travelling Exhibition and Online Film Screening on the Occasion of 120th Birth Anniversary of Master Architect Louis I Kahn

On the auspicious moment of the Global Master, Architect Louis I Kahn's 120th birth anniversary, Institute of Architects, Bangladesh (IAB) organized a pop-up public exhibition "अफ्राध्र कान - Reverence KAHN" at the promenade adjacent to his magnum opus, the National Parliament Building, Manik Mia Avenue, Dhaka featuring notable drawings by Kahn, scaled model, essays and interview on Kahn, rare photographs of the Capitol Complex etc. The exhibition, supported by the "Louis I Kahn's 120th Birth Anniversary Celebration Council (Kahn120)", is a traveling kind which is planned to occur at various places of the country.

The first event was opened to public from 10am to 10pm on 20 February 2021 on the day of the maestro's 120th birth anniversary. The exhibition attracted a number of Kahn enthusiasts as well as the city dwellers. The exhibition featured essays from Ar. Prof. Shamsul Wares, Ar. Prof. Kazi Khaleed Ashraf, Ar. Prof. Adnan Zillur Morshed & Ar. Saif Ul Hague, an interview by Ar. Marina Tabassum, sketches of Louis Kahn from Architectural Archive of Pennsylvania University, a drawing of the master plan of Sher-e-Bangla Nagar provided by the Dept. of Architecture, Ministry of Housing & Public Works, a sketch of the capitol by Ar. Dr. Sajid-Bin-Doza, a scaled model of the Kahn's citadel and rare photographs of

the capitol complex taken by Ar. Enamul Karim and Ar. Dr. Nurur Rahman Khan.

A public conference in presence of the media, notable number of architects, students, volunteers and city dwellers, happened beside the ongoing exhibition. Ar. Prof. Shamsul Wares presented a mesmerizing keynote speech. Among the presence, Chief Architect, Dept. of Architecture, Ar. Mir Manzurur Rahman, Aga Khan Laureate Ar. Saif Ul Haque, Past Presidents of IAB Ar. Kazi Golam Nasir & Ar. Jalal Ahmad, Ar. Dr. Nurur Rahman Khan and Co-Conveners of Kahn120, Ar. Md. Wahiduzzaman Ratul & Ar. Sakib Ahsan Choudhury spoke on the occasion. Beforehand, President of IAB, Ar. Mubasshar Hussain welcomed the audience and General Secretary of IAB, Ar. Farhana Sharmin Emu concluded the session with a Vote of Thanks. The session was moderated by the Vice President (International Relations) of IAB, Ar. Md. Ishtiaque Zahir. Eminent architects, artists, journalists and city dwellers visited the exhibition. The event was covered by national dailies.

The traveling exhibition placed its second anchor at IAB Centre from 13 to 18 of March, 2021. In presence of the members of the IAB EC, Ar. Md. Ishtiaque Zahir, Vice President (International Relations) inaugurated the session. Later that night, a feature film on Kahn's work called "The Tigers City" aired on a member only zoom session through IAB. Ar. Md. Ishtiaque Zahir introduced the film maker and art historian, Sundaram Tagore to the audience to spoke before the screening. Ar. Saif Ul Hague & Ar. Marina Tabassum also spoke of the occasion. Secretary - Seminar & Convention Ar. M Taufugur Rahman Khan conducted the session. The exhibition remained open for all for next five days. The event was also covered by national dailies and featured on satellite televisions.

During this prevailing pandemic, the exhibition has designed and curated keeping the social distancing guideline in mind. The 12 solid plywood monoliths each commemorating a decade since Kahn's birth has a triangular base which ensures the social distancing of spectators abreast. These events were sponsored by Vistaara Architects Pvt Ltd, Vitti Sthapati Brindo Ltd and Tania Karim N R Khan & Associates. The countrywide anchorage of the traveling exhibition is currently on hold due to unfavorable peak of the pandemic.



IAB Ensures Consent from Different Actors and Stakeholders Related to Its Proposals for World Heritage Tentative List

A Step Forward to Ensure the Enlistment



On 18 January 2021, The Institute of Architects Banaladesh (IAB) sought kind endorsement of the Honorable Prime Minister, Sheikh Hasina for inclusion of the National Assembly Complex and the Architectural works of Muzharul Islam in the World Heritage Tentative List by UNESCO in December 2020. The Honorable Prime Minister expressed her kind endorsement on the efforts undertaken by the Institute of Architects Bangladesh vide the Message Letter. The effort was initiated by the 23rd Executive Council of IAB and the 24th Executive Council expresses its humble gratitude to them for their effort.

On 17 February 2021, Department of Archaeology, Ministry of Cultural Affairs, GOB organized the Final Sharing Seminar on Updating the UNESCO Tentative List of Bangladesh. The Department of Archaeology proposed cultural affairs ministry to submit the names of eight sites, including the National Parliament complex and Architectural work of Muzharul Islam to the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization for the sites' inscription on the tentative list of World Heritage Site.

Mr. KM Khalid, State Minister for Cultural Affairs; M Badrul Arefin, Secretary Cultural Affairs Ministry, UNESCO Representative to Bangladesh Beatrice Kaldun, Ar. Farhana Sharmin Emu, General Secretary, IAB, Ar. Mohammad Sazzad Hossain, Secretary, Heritage & Culture, IAB, Ar. Dr. Sharif Shams Imon, Ar. Sujaul Islam Khan, Ar. Muhtadin Iqbal, Ar. Md. Wahiduzzaman Ratul, attended the meeting.

As a part of the process of World Heritage Tentative Listing, it was a requirement for IAB to take consent from the responsible authorities of different sites to propose the respective sites for world Heritage Tentative List. Hence IAB officially requested different authorities for consent.



The endorsement letter of Sheikh Hasina, the Hon'ble Prime Minister of Bangladesh, regarding inclusion of the National Assembly Complex and the Architectural works of Muzharul Islam in the World Heritage Tentative List





On 18 February 2021, IAB President Ar. Mubasshar Hussain, Vice-President (National Affairs); Ar. Khan Md. Mustapha Khalid; General Secretary, Ar. Farhana Sharmin Emu and Secretary, Heritage & Culture Ar. Mohammad Sazzad Hossain had an online meeting with the Hon'ble Speaker of the Bangladesh Parliament Dr. Shirin Sharmin Chaudhury, MP and requested the consent letter required for IAB to move forward with its proposal for inclusion of the 'National Assembly Complex, Bangladesh' in the World Heritage Tentative List. Hon'ble Speaker instantly expressed her full support and thanked IAB for taking such an important initiative. Hon'ble Speaker also noted the proposal of making a copy of Ar. Louis I. Kahn's original drawings available for IAB in order to make a publication.

Afterwards IAB managed to receive the consent letters from Parliament secretariat and Ministry of Housing and Public Works regarding the proposal of National Assembly Complex.

Regarding Architectural Works of Muzharul Islam, IAB had to take the challenge of managing approval of different authorities associated with 17 different sites. In 2021 IAB managed to receive consent letters from Ministry of Housing and Public Works, Bangladesh Roads and Highways, Barishal Polytechnic Institute and Sylhet Polytechnic Institute.

However, in 2020, IAB managed to receive consent letters from Pabna Polytechnic Institute, Bogura Polytechnic Institute, Rangpur Polytechnic Institute, Jahangirnagar University, Chittagong University, Department of Archives and Library, GOB, Bangladesh Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (BCSIR), and Office of the Adjutant Generals, AHQ, Dhaka cantonment. IAB is still trying to get the consent letters from Dhaka University and BADC authority.

At first, in this international acquisition, the Institute congratulates its consultant Vitti Sthapati Brindo Ltd.


It may be mentioned here that after getting the land from the Government of Bangladesh in 1986, an open architectural design competition was called for the design of the IAB Centre in 2007. Following this, the results of the IAB Centre Design Competition were announced on 24 November 2007. Out of about forty design proposals, three more special mention awards were announced, including first, second, and third prizes, through a two-stage selection process, voted by honorable juries and IAB members. Where the proposal of Ar. Md. Ehsan Khan, Ar. Md. Ishtiaque Zahir, and Ar. Md. Iqbal Habib won the first prize. The Construction of the building began in 2012 and was inaugurated by Sheikh Hasina, Hon'ble Prime Minister, People's Republic of Bangladesh in 2016.

HONORABLE IAB Center, Home for Institute of MENTION **Architects Bangladesh** B-3 Public Amenity: Architect Location nstitutional Building Ehsan Khan Dhaka, Bangladesh The Institute of Architects Bangladesh is a self-supporting institute that actively works to promote excellence within education and the profession of architecture in Bangladesh. The design concept was to create a "home" for architects in Bangladesh that they could embrace as their own and where they could be inspired to contribute positively to their profession. Initially, the institutional structure was intended to be semi-permanent, so that the building could be dismantled on demand, with plans existing for constructing a larger institutional building in the future. The institution required facilities such as an administration area, a multi-purpose hall, and rooms for accommodating different categories of lectures, seminars, and socio programs. JURY CITATION: The project is very well completed with fine details and coordination of diffe materials. The steel-column roof provides wonderful semi-outdoor space on the ground floor where the open lounge welcomes all visitors and encourages communications among staffs. The multi-function room with sliding walls also increases the semi-outdoor space area and allows interactions between interior and exterior.

The Community Building for Women's Literacy and Healthcare, in Rajapur village, Chandpur; is a charity run by the Mannan Foundation Trust, which helps disadvantaged people in the remote low-lying village specially to empower local women by providing income generating and literacy skills, as well as free healthcare.

The building is a live practice-based research. This research received a commendation for the Annual Theme: 'Building in Quality' category in the 2019 RIBA President's Awards for Research. The project has also been recognized by other international awards like Architecture Sans Frontieres Award and SEED/ Pacific Rim award.

The two-hour remembrance evening was concluded with the remarks of Ar. Sathirut Nui Tandanand, Past President of ARCASIA.










IAB Presents the First Report on AHPG in ACSR Session



The Team Leader of Kamalapur Railway Station (KRS)-Working Group, Ar. Nurur Rahman Khan gave a presentation to explain the ongoing activities of the working group and shared ideas with the participants to develop an inclusive



work plan regarding the KRS issue. The presentation also included relevant information, Newspaper articles and opinion sent to IAB from home and abroad. Ar. N. R. After a long discussion, the ambassador hinted on informing Kajima Corporation, the PPP's Japanese investor, regarding the matter before the next joint investment meeting scheduled on 24 February 2021. The JICA head confirms that the said demolition is not a direct resultant of the MRT Project. The State Minister, present in the discussion, assured his full cooperation to IAB.

On 8 March 2021 through an online session IAB shared relevant information and exchanged ideas related to Kamalapur Railway Station with its members.

On 15 March 2021 a team led by the President, Ar. Mubasshar Hussain had an online meeting with the representatives of Kajima Corporation, Dhaka Mass Rapid Transit Company Ltd, and Bangladesh Railway regarding KRS issues. The key objective of the discussion was to exchange views and ideas to save the Kamalapur Railway Station Complex. The other members of the IAB delegation were Ar. Farhana, Ar. Md. Iabal, Ar. N.R. Khan, Ar. Zakiul Islam, Ar. Rugun Uddin Bhuiya, Ar. Bayezid Mahbub Khondoker and Ar. Sazzad. Mr. Monirul Islam Firozi, Director (Engineering), Bangladesh Railway and Mr. Md. Abdul Baquee Miah, Additional Project Director (Civil), DMRTDP were also present.

Mr. Noburo Aoki, General Manager, New Market Planning Office, Overseas Operations Division, KAJIMA Corporation introduced the Kajima the Oriental Consultants Global and Nippon Koei as the core members of the Kamlapur MmTH Sub-working Group. His penetration included the conceptual proposal of Kamlapur MmTH approved by GoB in March 2019 and the summary of consequent discussions with GoB. However, Ar. N. R. Khan gave a presentation that included alternative design-approaches to achieve the goals of the aforementioned project even after ensuring the conservation of the heritage building. The presentation was prepared by Ar. Khan Md. Mustapha Khalid, Ar. Rugun Uddin Bhuiya, Ar. Razia Asad, Ar. Iqbal Habib and Ar. N. R. Khan. 

IAB's Efforts on Inswing DAP (2016-2035)

The Detailed Area Plan for Dhaka





The Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha (RAJUK), started the preparation of the Detailed Area Plan (DAP) 2010-2015 for the areas under RAJUK under the Dhaka Structure Plan (1995-2015) in 2004 to develop the 400-year-old historical Dhaka as a planned city, which was published in the form of Gazette on 22 June 2010. The Detailed Area Plan (DAP) 2016-2035 has taken the initiative to take up the project by incorporating new areas with various complexities related to the implementation of the DAP and the difficulties of land use, which has now been published by RAJUK in a draft form. The new proposed DAP concentrates on better management and governance (planning and implementation),

civic amenities (health, education, communication, infrastructure), urban lifestyle and land management (flood land, resettlement), housing, and population density. Primarily, the proposed draft suggested, reducing the height of the building by locality to control the population density. After discussions with IAB, RAJUK has considered switching the plan of controlling the height of the building to particularization of FAR to manage the population density. IAB has their point of view and propositions for FAR and land use, which will be presented at a workshop to be organized by RAJUK to finalize the DAP.

A committee, headed by architect lqbal Habib is working to review the objectives and observations of the Dhaka Metropolitan "Detailed Area Plan 2016-2035" (Draft), which includes Housing, Transportation, Water Management, Population Density, Building Height, City Capacity, Environment, Economy, Decentralization of the City, Urban Governance, Institutional Power, etc.

On 12 January 2021 and 8 March 2021, through online sessions, IAB shared relevant information and exchanged ideas with its members regarding the specific suggestions on proposed DAP. The Team leader of DAP-Working Group, Ar. Iqbal Habib gave presentations to explain the ongoing activities of the working group and shared ideas with the participants to develop an inclusive work. IAB Plays Active Role with Key Actors to Control the Unplanned Development in the Heritage Sites and its Surrounding Areas

On 29 January 2021, Ar. Dr. Abu Sayeed M Ahmed, Chairperson, Heritage Practice and Policy Formulation Committee, IAB; Ar. Mohammad Sazzad Hossain, Secretary-Heritage & Culture, IAB; Mr. Ashraful Islam, Project Director, DAP, RAJUK and representatives from BIP and RAJUK visited Banashal Jam-E-Mosque, Dhakeshwari Temple, Raja Ramohon Roy Library, Hussani Dalan and surrounding areas to assess the impact of the proposed construction work. The visiting team examined the core zone and identified problems in the proposed construction work that may disturb physical access and visual access to the heritage structures.

On 15 February 2021, in a meeting at RAJUK, Ar. Dr. Sayeed, IAB, Ar. Sazzad Hossain, Mr. Ashraful Islam, Muhammad Ariful Islam and other representatives of RAJUK discussed different legal issues associated with some of the sites of the proposed construction work. The team opined to take action according to the order of the court in such cases. However, the team also recommended some guidelines for the proposed construction work to protect the core zone with focus on the heritage values, proper access and visual exposure. Afterwards, Ar. Khan Md. Mustapha Khalid, Vice President (National Affairs) on behalf of IAB, checked & signed the minutes of the meeting.

Online Commemoration Program to Mark the 100th Birth Anniversary of Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman



On the occasion of the centennial birth anniversary of the Architect of Independent Bangladesh, the greatest Bengali of all time, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, IAB arranged a commemoration webinar to pay tribute to the undisputed leader on 17 March 2021.
